dungeon.



When Jesus was baptised, the heavens were opened and the Spirit of God came upon him.

Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptised by John. John tried to dissuade him. 'It is I who need baptism from you,' he said 'and yet you come to me!' But Jesus replied, 'Leave it like this for the time being; it is fitting that we should, in this way, do all that righteousness demands.' At this, John gave in to him.

As soon as Jesus was baptised he came up from the water, and suddenly the heavens opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming down on him. And a voice spoke from heaven, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him.'

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Breaking Open the Word

THE BELOVED

Today's feast that celebrates the baptism of Jesus with the story of his baptism from Matthew's Gospel. The story, written in the mid-80s, is slightly different to what our ears would usually hear. It begins with John the Baptist's humble unwillingness to baptise Jesus. 'It is I who need baptism from you... and yet you come to me!' (3:14) While John's conviction is appropriate, Jesus encourages John to baptise him.

Perhaps Matthew's story reflects a historical memory of some who might have believed that perhaps John was the Messiah. This lingering memory is addressed in the dialogue between John and Jesus. Matthew's version, nevertheless, accentuates Jesus' humility in undergoing the baptismal ritual, very familiar to the Gospel's audience of Jewish followers of Jesus. Ritual bathing was part of a Jewish purification process before they entered places of holiness. Every Jewish house had its own *mikveh*, the ritual purification bath.

In today's Gospel, Jesus becomes that place of holiness in his baptism, in the *mikveh* of the Jordan River. God's Spirit descends upon him and God's voice attests, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him' (3:17). These words about Jesus' belovedness will be heard again as he is transfigured on the mountain (17:5) *en route* to Jerusalem where death awaits. God's attestation of Jesus, of God's delight in him, despite everything that will unfold in the remaining chapters of the Gospel, never leaves him. This divine conviction about Jesus and God's words are also God's conviction and words that the evangelist wants the Gospel audience, including us, to hear. All people, female and male, are God's beloved ones. God's delight and favour rests upon us. It is a Gospel conviction that we need to remember especially when life's struggles come our way.

CATHOLIC Q & A

Why does the Priest kiss the Altar? Some do it after the last blessing at Mass and some do not. Is there some reason?

For Catholics, the altar is not merely a piece of furniture. It is loaded with precious symbolism.

Along with the pulpit, where the word of God is proclaimed, it is the focal point of our meeting with God the Father in and through Jesus Christ. If the liturgy of the Eucharist is the central event which brings us to the Father “through him (Christ) with him and in him” the altar around which this happens holds a place of primary honor and dignity. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal explains “The altar on which the Sacrifice of the Cross is made present under the sacramental signs is also the table of the Lord to which the people of God is called together to participate in the Mass, as well as the centre of the thanksgiving that is accomplished through the Eucharist”.

The church extends this by referring to the altar not only as the place of renewing the sacrifice of Jesus, but as Jesus himself.

This is why the Church sees the altar (not the crucifix or even the tabernacle, containing the Blessed Sacrament) as the central and focal point of these buildings where we gather to celebrate the Eucharist. It is also why tradition has called for the bishop, priest and deacon to venerate the altar, usually with a kiss. Instructions for the Mass direct the Priest to kiss the altar at the beginning and end of Mass.


CHOIR MEMBERS WANTED
